LISTENER'S GUIDE

TO SAINT LUKE'S HEARING LOOP RECEIVERS

If you are hard of hearing, but do not use hearing aids – or if your hearing aids lack T-coils – you may still use our hearing loop system. Tell a greeter at the church entrance you wish to borrow a hearing loop receiver and headphones during the service. Please return the receiver and headphones to a greeter as you leave.

- Place the receiver in your breast pocket or use the built-in neck cord to hang the receiver around your neck. This positions the receiver properly to receive the strongest audio signal.
- Plug headphones into the jack at the top of the receiver.
- Adjust headband and place headphones on both ears. For a snug fit place left earpiece on left ear and right earpiece on right ear. They are clearly marked.
- Slowly turn the volume control until it clicks “on.” The receiver’s red and green LED indicators will flash briefly when the unit turns on. This confirms that the battery is not depleted. Turn volume control clockwise to increase volume.
- Adjust volume control to a comfortable sound level. For best reception, keep the receiver upright; do not place it on its side in the pew.
- You may use your personal headphones or earbuds if you prefer. Our receivers will accept any such devices that have a standard 3.5 mm audio plug.

If a borrowed loop receiver malfunctions, seek assistance from a greeter.

There are many different models of hearing loop receivers on the market, and our system is compatible with most of them. You are welcome to use your personal loop receiver if you have one.

If you wish to purchase a personal loop receiver identical to those we loan to members of the congregation, the model we use is the HLR III Induction Hearing Loop Receiver, manufactured by Oval Window Audio. As of this writing, the cost per unit is \$99.95 with free ground shipping.
